Parish Council News Autumn 2021

Hello Everyone,

I am putting my notes together on arguably one of the hottest days of the year and it makes me reflect on the different sorts of weather we have experienced this year. Earlier in the year we thought it would not stop raining when many of our walks were under water. Then we have had days of nearly record breaking temperatures with the Met Office issuing warnings of potential danger to health. For those of us that can remember 1976, memories come flooding back.

Anyway we must get on to business and during this last quarter the Parish Council has been very busy, reflected in the minutes which are always available to all on the PO Notice Board and on the Village Web Site, oakleyvillage.co.uk/ parish-council The major issues and consultations have been East/West Rail, Oxford/Cambridge Arc and the Bedford Borough Plan 2040. Councillors and Clerk have been beavering away on these and many others. Recently we also drew up our own emergency plan for the village to be used in the event of an emergency occurring in our midst. We hope to have drawn up the very best emergency plan and that it never needs to be used.

Highfield Road Railway Bridge

Unfortunately our objections to Bedford Borough Council concerning the alterations to Highfield Road Railway Bridge were unsuccessful. On 25 May 2021 Bedford Borough Council Planning Department gave Network Rail (NR) prior approval to carry out their planned work. Should you wish to read details of the application and the full report this can be done by going to www.bedford.gov.uk/searchplans and click the link VIEW & COMMENT and type in Application number 20/02157/ P18 in Simple search box, click on Search button. For the documentation click on the DOCUMENTS tab, followed by VIEW ASSOCIATED DOCUMENTS. The document shows the decision and Officers Report, which explains how the decision was made.



Highfield Road Railway Bridge (continued)

The brief the report concludes; "It is recognised that this bridge is a gateway into the village of Oakley and is prominent from the wider area because of its elevated position. However there is also a real public safety need from the electrification of this railway line and whilst a lower parapet and/or permanent masonry design solution has been considered and discussed, for the reasons set out in the report these are not viable or realistic options.

The GRP brickwork design solution being put forward across the whole bridge, is therefore considered, on balance, to meet the safety needs of Network Rail, as well as ensuring the character and

appearance of the area is not detrimentally harmed.

The development is therefore considered to meet the tests (set out in Part 18, Class A to Schedule 2 of the GPDO), of both being acceptable in terms of its location (criteria a), and in terms of the ensuring the amenity of the neighbourhood is not injured by reason of its design and appearance (criteria b) particularly when weighing up any harm against the public benefit and safety improvements that will result from the works.

It is therefore recommended that the Local Planning Authority gives its prior approval to the detailed plans and specifications."

In respect of the first consultation Bedford Borough Council received 26 objections from 23 households, but in respect of the amended application there were only 4 objections from 4 households. I am grateful to the 26 people who took the trouble to raise their objections, though I have to admit to some disappointment that there could not have been a lot more.

Campaign to Protect Rural England

Earlier this year CPRE Bedfordshire invited Parish Councils to nominate areas or projects for consideration for awards under different categories. One of the categories was "Living Countryside Award for Better Places to Live."

We put a case together for Linch Furlong, Community Orchard and Riverside Meadow to be considered. Abbeyfields Roundabout in Elstow won this category, but I am delighted to tell you that our submission was runner up and has been HIGHLY COMMENDED.

The judges said they were pleased to be able to recognize all the hard work and positive impact our projects have on the local community. The Parish Council is extremely grateful for this recognition and our award is a result of the way Patrick Knight manages these sites for us; we thank him very much.

On behalf of the Council I would also like to thank everyone who contributed to the initial work to make Linch Furlong and the Community Orchard viable in the first place.

Litter Pick 2021

Our annual Litter Pick will take place on **Saturday 11 September 2021** between 10am and noon the day before The Oakley Show. YOU are very welcome to attend and help. Children with an adult are also very welcome and the meeting point is the Scout Hut near the Village Hall.

Summer at College Farm...

Well, what a harvest it has been and its not over yet! I thought last year's harvest was very stop and start but this year has proved to be more challenging! The weather is entirely to blame. It appears that our 'summer' is now April and May! It has been very frustrating at times but we are getting there!

In between harvest we have been cultivating, preparing the ground for crops to be drilled later in the year, muck spreading to improve the ground, baling grass, largely for silage which is used to feed cattle in the winter months when they come in from the fields.

Our cows are enjoying the grass down the river meadows and in the field opposite the farmhouse. Grass seems to be growing well now compared to earlier in the year where all farmers were worried we would run out! Most of our cows are in calf and should start calving soon.

We had pest control at the farm earlier in the week – I am sure you can imagine we attract all sorts of wild rodents and they can get quite out of control. We therefore have to keep the matter under control to protect crops and ensure our farm animals don't catch harmful diseases.

We were disappointed that the police had been called on this occasion. Our farm contact details

are easily located online so if anyone has any concerns we would appreciate they called us first rather than waste police time and resources. The police helicopter disturbed our cows and probably woke most of the residents in what was a complete waste of time.

We are pleased that life is getting more back to normal, village events are back on and teas in church has restarted. Its great to see the local community come together and raise money for fantastic causes.

Farming wife duties...

Our young calves are growing nicely and the older ones will hopefully become mothers in the spring next year. We are looking forward to seeing the calves they produce.

We are still feeding them nuts in the morning but they have the grass to graze on all day. My daughter and I went to the Fairy Garden and were blown away by the range of activities on offer and the level of detail that the organisers had gone to! Thank you for such a lovely afternoon out.

In addition to helping on the farm, I have recently completed a Cockerel commission and launched some new homeware products, including personalised Christmas baubles and tractor bone china jugs. Feel free to browse my website ljcreativestudios.com

Welcome to our 2021 overview of our Flower and Christmas tree season. Yet again it has been a challenging year. The weather has been all over the place! The merri month of May 'should' have been the start of our flower selling season, but the weather was far too cold to kick start our season and we had to postpone all of our May events to June.

Come June, things were on the up. Wedding flower orders cancelled in 2020 started trickling in, but they were no way near as big as we were used to in 2019 because of the 30 person restrictions. What we did not sell to Florists, we gathered for Friday Flower deliveries within Oakley and five miles of our farm. Picked For You gift orders also picked up, many of which we also delivered within Oakley.

Fast forward to July and we started re-hosting our Pick Your Own Flower experiences. By the end of July we were able to add in more and more dates as our flowers flourished and now we are near enough fully booked on all our PYO days up until the end of September. We even managed to get a mention in The Floral Arranger magazine as a venue to come and Pick Your Own Dahlias in the UK, so if you are a fan of Dahlia maybe see if you can visit us soon too.

Come the end of September our flower season 'should' be over, but who knows, we might be gifted with an Indian Summer. September is always a strange month for us. It is the month we start height tagging Christmas trees for wholesale

orders and renumberina our rows of Christmas trees to ensure our Tag Your Christmas Tree days go smoothly. Year on year our trees grow another foot but fear not we shall be opening a new plot of trees this



year to tag and our first date for tagging will be 30th October.

This year we have some wonderfully local wreath makers onboard to help us create wreaths and more delivery people recruited to offer more delivery slots around Bedfordshire.

We do hope more Oakley residents will come our way to support our businesses. Supporting local businesses is so important for the local economy, especially a seasonal one like ours that is on your doorstep. Oakley Speedwatch -**Needs YOU!**

We need more volunteers so that roadside speedmonitoring exercises can be arranged without relying so much on the few volunteers we have at the moment. About two exercises are arranged every month: they take place at various times in daylight hours, at various locations in the village and last for around two hours.

Please contact Paul Phillips or Ann Paice if you would be willing to volunteer and are over 18 years of age.

Speedwatch operations had been largely abandoned due to Covid, apart from the monitoring of speeding at various locations, using the Morelock equipment.

It was apparent that speeding had become worse over the last year and it was decided that the speedwatch exercise should be resumed. The speedwatch volunteers met in mid-June to consider developments and arrange the resumption of road-side exercises.

The following numbers (part of the full report) make disturbing reading and show that speeding in the village is again a serious issue, having become worse than before the start of the pandemic:-

Location: Highfield Road.

Direction: Facing roundabout off Paula Radcliffe

Way.

From Saturday May 1st 12.12pm to Tuesday May

25th 8.30am 2021, 23.8 days



Out of the 3,584 Departing speeders in the 23 days (151 per day) there were 34 instances of 50mph and over. The fastest of these was travelling at 62mph as it passed the Morelock device near the bridge. What is worse is that it was a lorry! It was at 5.34pm in the evening a busy time for pedestrians.

There were 2,027 Arriving speeders (85 per day) with 31 at 50mph and over. The fastest was a car at 64mph at 6.27 in the morning and second was again a lorry at 62mph at 5.54 in the evening.

Further analysis of information recorded by the Morelock equipment suggests that the display of speed, when presented to motorists, has a noticeable effect on their compliance with the speed limit. This could justify considering the installation of further displays in key locations round the village.

The additional equipment would be costly and warrants further research and careful consideration. Some of the team have carried out initial surveys and costings so that a report can be presented to the parish council at the September meeting. Funding would need to be sought before further progress could even be considered, but this is a matter of safety, high on the list of many residents' concerns. Steve Nicholas





Phantom Sprayer

We have had some lovely weather, some extremely hot weather and some very wet weather, what a mixture and with all this we need to exercise our beloved and very beautiful dogs.



Whilst the majority of pet owners pick up after their dogs and dispose in the bins and also, if their children are allowed to walk the family pet, then they train them to also pick up and dispose, so our streets fields and favourite walks are cleaner. Nonetheless there is an element of people who still do not care about anything. They do not clear up after their dogs, persistently take them to the same places to deposit and then just leave it regardless of where they are and whether it is a children's play area, or just on a footpath, to spoil some else's walks. Presumably if they have children and allow them to walk the dog, they do not train their children to pick up either.

I would appeal to those guilty people, please join the majority, and clean up after the dog. It is quite easy and there are places to dispose of the full bag within easy reach of anywhere in the village. Please do not just leave the bag or hang it in the hedge. **Find a bin and leave it in that**. Please remember that if you are caught not clearing up after your dog you may be fined £70 each time. This would add up rather if you were caught on a regular basis.

Please all be aware of the rising dog thefts and take care when walking your dog. Keep it within easy re-call and beware of strangers taking a great interest in your dog. The police are doing their best to find the stolen dogs and return them to their owners, but this often proves to be difficult. Neighbourhood Watch are also setting up dog watch patrols. If you feel you would like to help I am sure they would welcome you; anything to deter these callous and heart-breaking thieves.

Oakley Allotments

The allotments are once again fully occupied and looking the best they have ever looked: fully occupied, but not fully worked, unfortunately. A few plots have been untended for a while and weeds, going to seed, affect those who work hard to maintain their allotment in good condition. Allotments will be inspected within the next few weeks and notice may be given to those tenants who do not, at the very least, control the weeds.

The waiting-list has six names on it now – I received no reply from emails to four Oakley residents on the list, so their names will be retained and I will attempt to contact them just once more when allotments next become available.

It is undoubtedly hard work starting on an allotment, particularly if it has not been tended for a while, but everyone I talk to enjoys the challenge, the physical work and the satisfaction of making the space their own. It does not have to involve heavy digging and weeding though, as one couple explained to me recently.

They have been using a "no dig" method for a number of years now, with a great deal of success – the results they have achieved, with minimal effort after the initial setting-up, are there to see.

The main work to keep the method going from season to season involves covering the ground with a good layer of organic matter, which can be composted material, soil conditioners and manure. The soil eventually becomes easier to plant, easier to weed, retains moisture well and becomes home to healthy populations of worms and other vital organisms.

Charles Dowding's book, "No dig gardening", is one of the recommended sources of information for those interested in the technique (there are other books by other authors available).





Whatever method you prefer to use, the results are now showing. The late and unhelpful spring weather has turned into a mostly warm and damp summer... a good thing! All over the allotments there is an abundance of different plants, vegetables and flowers, thriving and providing much sustenance to their growers.

Of course, there are failures as well as successes and they are all part of the adventure. Every year is different, weather playing a major role. Some years benefit certain pests and diseases – this year many of us have had to remove tomato plants because tomato blight has hit, yet last year I grew tomato plants successfully outside and bottled the tomatoes for later use.

This year we let potatoes grow where they sprouted from escapees from last year's harvest (we always get some of those!) and we gained several kilos of extra spuds "free" from those plants. It all adds to the satisfaction of keeping an allotment going.

The allotments management committee, now active again, is focussed on keeping the allotments in good order and maintaining the area generally. A working-party is planned for the beginning of September and some hedge-trimming and tidying will be undertaken. Anyone who is interested in joining us for a few hours will be most welcome – please contact me for details. Please also contact me (or Ann Paice) if you are interested in joining the wait to take on an allotment of your own.




