I am sure we will encounter some hiccups along the way, but for a first attempt I think you will agree they have done an amazing job. We were facing the challenge of changing the software we use from Publisher as it will be shortly withdrawn from the market. Initially they are stopping doing any updates and then it will not only be impossible to purchase, but users will not be able to open publisher files they have saved on their computers, and are advised to save them in a different format . We are now using Adobe InDesign software, and I am hugely grateful to both Ben and Larissa for taking it on and I hope they find the experience very valuable. We will no doubt in due course fill you in on these two delightful individuals, but you can appreciate this month we have been pretty stretched to get the magazine done in time.

There have been some stunning flower arrangements in church this last month with Easter (p17) and then VE 80 closely following (see p19). The raising of the flag was performed during a short service, and that was probably the only time this week there was not a single breath of wind, which made it a singularly unimpressive photo opportunity. as it hung limply unmoving. The service conducted by Rev. Ian was very moving

and the children from the school sang for us, There were few dry eyes amongst us. It was just beautiful (p17). The service at the War Memorial was attended by the Lord-Lieutenant and her deputies and was a very moving occasion (see front cover). Many people came to join in the service, and the Last Post played by Christine Smith at the beginning created a very poignant atmosphere. Many wreaths were laid at the War Memorial by different groups in the village, and also by the LeFanu family for Anthony LeFanu and the Pool family for Peter Pool, both killed in the war. Both families also remembered them with special flower arrangements in the church.

The candles of peace lit during the evening service can be seen forming the shape of the cross (p19), and with the dimmed lighting in church as darkness fell was incredibly atmospheric. Altogether a day of remembrance and celebration and unforgettable.

There are new fellowship opportunities starting up at church open to everyone, with proposed visits to the Panacea Museum and St Albans Abbey and also weekly opportunities for cake and chatter every Thursday (*See p6 for details*). The Pop Up Café is incredibly popular on the 2nd Saturday of the month and, if you time it right, a sausage bap and a cake can avoid the need for lunch later!!

There is a Garden Party planned in the Vicarage Garden on 28th June. A lovely poster on *p12* has been created by Elisa from the school, which tells you all the wonderful games, stalls and entertainment available. So don't miss it. Any help for this will be gladly received. Aren't we all lucky to live in Renhold.

## LETTER FROM THE VICAR

 $\operatorname{W}$  hen I was very young there was a programme on TV called "That was the week, that was", and I can honestly say that this week has been one of the most exhilarating weeks I have experienced in parish ministry. It has been a joy, pleasure and a privilege to be part of the VE80 commemorations within the parish, and I have to say yet again, that I am blessed to be here with you. From our early morning Church service on 8th May with a Deputy Lord Lieutenant in attendance, where the Proclamation was read and the Union flag raised, and the school choir sang beautifully, through our Civic Remembrance at 11:00am with the Lord Lieutenant of Bedfordshire leading the wreath laying, to our final evening service when we lit a cross of 102 candles for Hope and Peace and joined with the nation in singing I vow to thee my country, it was an amazing day. In addition to these services there were the most amazing floral displays in church, and the church bells rang out with church bells across the country on a beautiful early summer evening ... "what a day that was" and one that will live with me for a long time to come - Thank you to all who contributed in any way to making this possible, and marking this historic occasion in a way that few other villages, towns or cities were able to do - Thank you Renhold!

In the same week we held our first "Fellowship Group" meeting with cheese and wine where there was a real "buzz" of conversation in the room, along with a general discussion on how those in attendance saw the group developing. Several potential trips and local activities were suggested and 3 events pencilled into diaries, the first being a visit to the Panacea Museum in Bedford on 6th June at 1:00pm: again this is not a closed group, it is not an exclusive "church group" but is for the Parish, its residents and community and is open to all. It has been one of my greatest desires for a group like this to be born and I am keen to see how it will grow - My next dream is a Youth Group which I hope will not be too far away now - Cake & Coffee Sessions on the

4th Thursday in each month continue to be well supported with 15 – 20 people spending a couple of hours socialising over cake and a never-ending supply of tea & coffee. As with the Fellowship Group and our "Pop-Up Coffee shop events", the buzz in the room with the various conversations taking place is a joy to be part of. Anyone and everyone are welcome to any of these events, no age or status qualifications are needed, so why not drop in on 26th June and join us for a "cuppa" and a piece of cake.

As you will see elsewhere in this edition of Renhold News, we are holding a "Garden Party" at the vicarage on Saturday 28th June between 2-5pm. This is primarily a fund-raising event to help the church to meet its financial responsibilities which equate to around £1,000 per week, but it is also an opportunity to join as a community to share time and enjoy the various musical entertainments throughout the afternoon. Personally, I am delighted the school choir. Renhold Quartet and the Ukulele Band are able to join us and thank them for their support. There will be various stalls and side events for families to take part in, and I can assure you there will be tea and cake available (as you would expect with me!) throughout the afternoon. Once again, this is a community event not just "for church people" and I hope that no one will feel excluded - Everyone really is welcome!

## Transporting Bedford 2030 – Greyfriars Junction

As part of the Transporting Bedford 2030 project, funded by the Towns Fund, changes are being made to Greyfriars Junction to improve connectivity, make it safer for cyclists and pedestrians, and support future development at the old police station site.

Plans include replacing the existing large roundabout with a signal-controlled junction, along with the introduction of new cycle lanes and pedestrian crossings. These improvements are designed to promote active travel, improve safety, and encourage economic growth in this key area of Bedford. The £2.31million project is also supported by £250,000 in funding from Bedfordshire Police.

#### Midland Road Regeneration -Public Realm Improvements

The northern side of Midland Road was completed before Christmas 2024. Construction on the southern side began in early January and is now well underway. The project remains on track for completion on 11 June.

Over the coming weeks, the bulk of the pavement and public realm improvements will be finalised. Once these are complete, works will continue into Alexandra Road, Alexandra Place, and Woburn Road, while resurfacing of Midland Road is scheduled to take place during May.

#### NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL DAYS IN JUNE PAULINE CAPELL

8th June - World Oceans Day

This year's theme is the importance of appreciating the wonder of our oceans and recognising the absolutely crucial role they play in sustaining life on earth. It calls for decision makers to prioritise the well-being of our oceans and inspire solutions. Oceans cover over 70% of the Earth's surface with most of them being unexplored or mapped, they produce over half of the world's oxygen, plus providing food and livelihoods for millions of people. All of us have a role to play, and maybe we could resolve to watch David Attenborough's new film 'Ocean' and hear him say that "After almost 100 years on this planet, I now understand the most important place on Earth is not on land but sea."

#### 14th June – King Charles's Official Birthday and Trooping the Colour

The tradition for British monarchs to have 2 birthdays dates back to George II. His actual birthday was in November, but he thought this was too cold a time for outdoor birthday celebrations, so declared an official birthday to tie up with the annual summer military parade known as Trooping the Colour. There is some speculation that as Prince William's actual birthday is on June 21st there will be no need for him to have an official birthday when he is monarch .

#### 15th June – Father's Day

This is said to have originated in the US in 1909 when Sonara Smart Dodd wanted to honour her father, who, following her mother's death, had raised 6 children through hard work and dedication. It is said that the popularity of a specific Father's Day in the UK grew post WWII, influenced by American troops stationed in Britain, yet wasn't officially recognised here until 1972. Traditionally roses were given to the fathers - red for those still living and white for those who were deceased ,so you can always return to tradition if you are agonising about

what to get your Dad on Father's day.

#### 23rd June – International Women in Engineering Day.

This dates back to 1919 when the Society of Women Engineers was formed, although an international day was not launched until 2014. During WW1, many women had been trained to fulfil engineering roles, and when the war ended they wanted to continue their careers in this field. After the Armistice, a Bill for the Restoration of Pre-war Practices threatened to make it illegal for any engineering firms to employ women if they had not done so before the war. At 11%, Britain now has the lowest percentage of women engineers in Europe. This is surprising when the UK was one of the first countries to allow women to study and receive certification at an academic level in maths and science. There are many examples of women in engineering in our history such as Henrietta Vansittart who, in the 1900s, developed the propellers for the Lusitania. Dame Caroline Haslett who created a fully electric home to free women from time consuming household chores, Beatrice Shilling, an aeronautical engineer, who invented a type of metal washer to prevent the engines of Hawker Hurricanes. Spitfires and Rolls Royce Merlins from stalling on tactical manoeuvre, plus Ailie MacAdam who was the engineer heading up the ambitious engineering project for the refurbishment of St Pancras Station and Crossrail.

#### 25th June – National Writing day

The National Literacy Trust found that last year, only 3 in 10 children and young people (8-18) enjoy writing in their free time, which is one of the lowest levels ever recorded, and yet half of children enjoy writing in school, which is 22% higher than last year. So here is a challenge - what is better than the sound of a 'real ' letter landing on your doormat? Why not put pen to paper and send someone a real letter on 25th June. even if you may have to take out a mortgage to afford the stamp and it may take a while for it to be delivered!



## WILD ABOUT RENHOLD

#### One: Sparrowhawk

Claire Boardman photographed this female Sparrowhawk on the birdbath in her back garden on The Spires. Female Sparrowhawks are around 25% larger than males and can weigh almost twice as much. Due to their size, female sparrowhawks are capable of successfully hunting and catching larger birds than males. While males commonly prey on tits, finches and sparrows, females target more substantial birds such as starlings, thrushes, blackbirds and even magpies and pigeons. The extra size and weight means that females move slower than males, so tend to hunt slower-moving birds. Claire's photo has captured the piercing yellow eye and the razor-sharp talons of this apex predator.

#### Two: Red Campion

Red Campion, also known as red Catchfly, is a perennial plant, which means it can live for a number of years, growing and blooming in spring and summer and dying back in autumn. It has rose-red flowers with five petals, each deeply notched and almost divided into two; its leaves and stems are hairy. In places where it grows alongside white campion, the two may hybridise to produce pinky or white blooms. It generally flowers about the same time as Bluebells and where the two species mix it creates a vibrant display of colour. Primarily a woodland plant, the one in the photo was in a slightly unusual habitat in an open field on the edge of the village.

#### Three: Cuckoo Flower

Cuckoo Flowers, also known as Ladies Smock, Mayflower or Milkmaids, gets its main name from the timing of its flowering in mid-April, just as Cuckoos return here. The flowers are usually veined with darker violet but in some areas pure white forms can be found. It is an important food plant for the caterpillars of the Orange-tip and the Greenveined White butterfly. It grows wherever there is damp ground - wet grassland, damp meadows, pond margins and along the banks of streams. It may also found on road verges and in ditches. It has been quite prominent in these habitats around Renhold in the past few weeks.

#### Four: Sunbeams

These striking sunbeams appeared through broken clouds towards sunset one evening, looking towards Ravensden from opposite Renhold Village Hall. They are formed when particle-scattered sunlight is projected through gaps in the clouds. Whatever the causes, it created a very celestial effect!
