

It seems a while since I last penned the editorial and many steaming hot days have been endured since then. There have been several enjoyable events in the last couple of months. The Vicar's garden party was well attended, despite the incredibly high temperatures, and almost £1000 was raised for church funds. Thanks to all the many people behind the scenes who contributed to it (see pp16,17).

LETTER FROM THE VICAR

utumn is upon us – I know I sound year is flying by, but for me this is one of my favourite times of the year where the harvest is being gathered in and the colours of the trees turn from green to gold and beyond to a rich brown. I love it as the leaves start to tumble down, creating a crisp carpet underfoot for us to trudge through in our "wellies"; but it is more than that. Nature is amazing when you consider that these leaves look dead and lifeless to us now, but across the winter they will decompose into a rich natural fertiliser to promote strong growth next spring – God's wonderful creation and the incredible natural "Eco balance" Yes I love it!

As you read this the new school year is about to start with the children returning from their holidays refreshed and ready to learn. It is a time of excitement and promise, much like the autumn season in church. Our first major festival is of course harvest which this year will be preceded by our scarecrow festival on 20th & 21st September. This is an event that we hope the whole Parish will join in with, by either making and displaying a scarecrow, or supporting us by buying a trail map to search out the creative masterpieces in people's gardens etc. and then voting for your favourite. We have received several entry forms already, but more are always welcome, and we look forward to a funfilled weekend in Renhold. The prize giving (cash I believe) will be during our Harvest Songs of Praise at 4:00pm on 28th September, which will be followed by seasonal refreshment. During our morning Harvest Communion Service on 28th September, we will be receiving and blessing gifts of products for the local foodbank and the collection that day will be donated to the Bishop's Harvest appeal. The appeal this year is in support of increasing access to education in under-resourced communities in

Uganda and Zambia. You can donate either through us at Church or online through Missiondirect.org - thank you again for your support for both these vital "charitable causes"

Slightly earlier in September an organisation called the "Beds and Herts Historic Churches Trust" hold their annual "Bike n Hike" day. This event generates income for them by participants from all over the home counties being sponsored as they cycle or walk (often with the help of a car) to visit the lovely churches throughout our diocese. The local church benefits immediately by keeping 50% of the money raised, the rest goes into a central fund to assist churches like ours when we undertake restoration or improvement works. This organisation was very generous to us a couple of vears ago when we undertook the floor restoration works, and we will be applying for help again when our major access project starts later this year. If you would like to take part or would like to sponsor our intrepid Renhold participants, sponsor forms will be in church or please ask Rev. Ian for more details.

As I hinted last month (and again I apologise).. We are planning a Christmas tree festival to be held in church across the weekend of 5th, 6th & 7th December and are inviting individuals and organisations across the Parish and local community to decorate a tree and display it for all to enjoy. The members of the congregation and the organisations of this parish are renowned for their creative minds and skilful hands, and we are excited to see what they come up with this year. I know it is still early days but please put your thinking caps on and let your mind run free! Entry forms will be available shortly and will be in church after the Scarecrow festival; I know it is going to be great again this year – thank you for your support





WILD ABOUT RENHOLD - TONY PLOSZAJSKI

One - Black rabbit

This unusually coloured wild Rabbit is one of two that are regular with their more familiar grey-brown coloured relatives in fields alongside Renhold Brook. The technical term for this colour variant is melanism and it is caused by a genetic mutation that causes an excess of the pigment melanin, which darkens the fur. It is the opposite condition to albinism, where the absence of melanin leaves animals with white colouration. The effect is so marked in the Renhold black rabbits that even their traditional white tails are completely black.

Two - Blue tit

Claire Boardman got this lovely photo of a juvenile Blue Tit on the bird feeders in her garden. As a young bird, it had not yet fully acquired the blue components of the adult plumage. Blue Tits are familiar visitors to gardens in Renhold and numbers have increased in the UK in recent years, doubtless helped by the provision of artificial nest boxes and garden bird feeders. They typically lay between seven and 13 eggs, although infant mortality is high. Blue Tits typically live for around three years, however around two-thirds of young birds do not survive their first year.

Three - Marsh Tiger Hoverfly
Julian Roberts photographed this striking
Marsh Tiger hoverfly in his garden. It's black
and gold stripes are an obvious clue to the
source of its name and the parallel patterning
on its thorax like a stripy sports shirt, give it
its alternative nickname 'the footballer'. It is a
relatively common species that is associated
with a wide variety of waterbodies, from large
lakes and rivers down to areas as small as
ditches, small ponds and muddy puddles.

Four - Yellowhammer

Yellowhammers have been present in good numbers around the village this summer, often singing prominently from bushes and wires, particularly in the vicinity of the Village Hall. Yellowhammers are a species of bunting and males like the one in the photo are unmistakable with a bright yellow

head and underparts, brown back streaked with black and a chestnut rump. In flight, it shows white outer tail feathers. Despite being widespread across the UK until the 1960s, the Yellowhammer is declining rapidly, disappearing from some of Scotland entirely and becoming a scarce sight in many other places. The national population plummeted by 61% between 1967 and 2020 due to a lack of food and nesting habitat, so their continued survival around Renhold is a feather in the cap for the conservation-minded farming practices around much of the parish.

Five - 'The Birds of Bedfordshire'

For much of the past four years, I've spent a lot of my spare time writing a book on 'The Birds of Bedfordshire'. It is finally complete and is due to be published by the Bedfordshire Natural History Society in September. The book contains 500 pages and 400 colour photos of birds in the county, along with the key birdwatching sites. It analyses bird population trends, particularly in the past 30 years or so and assesses the factors like climate and habitat change that have affected them. The entire proceeds from the sale of the book will be divided equally between two very worthy environmental causes: The restoration and development of Clophill Lakes Nature Reserve, which featured on the cover of the June edition of the Renhold Magazine and was recently subject to a devastating arson attack, that will cost an estimated £100,000 to rectify, and the purchase and management of Strawberry Hill Farm in Knotting Green, which is the summer home of an amazing 36 pairs of Nightingales and also hosts a range of other threatened species like Turtle Dove and Grasshopper Warbler. The purchase price of the book is likely to be around £50. RENHOLD PARISH COUNCIL AUGUST UPDATE

PROPOSED RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT - LAND BETWEEN HOOKHAMS LANE AND RAVENSDEN ROAD, SALPH END, RENHOLD

Manor Oak Homes have communicated an intention to develop on this area of land in the parish. This land has come forward previously for large scale residential development, and was refused by the Borough Council, with the application taken to appeal, with the appeal at that time being dismissed.

This more recent proposal included several Renhold properties receiving a letter setting out details relating to the proposals. Renhold Parish Council were only made aware of this intended communication circulation very shortly in advance, so did not have sufficient opportunity to engage with Manor Oak Homes in regards to the statements they published. The Parish Council have fed back their disappointment at the inaccurate information shared with the Renhold community which is misleading.

Renhold Parish Council have already commenced work on reviewing the associated information that has been made available regarding this site, continuing as usual to be thorough with the approach being taken, and keeping residents up to date as much as possible.

The site does have a current live application that has been submitted to Bedford Borough Council as the local planning authority, the details of the application are planning application number 25/01308/EIASCR. The application is a request for Screening Opinion in respect of proposed residential development at Land Off Hookhams Lane. This is not a planning application for development. It is an application to determine if an Environmental Impact Assessment Screening Opinion needs to be undertaken on the site, as part of the planning process. Such an impact assessment looks at environmental factors in detail. The proposal is, that there is no need for a full environmental impact assessment for this site. Renhold Parish Council will be making representations on why there is such a need

for a full environmental impact assessment.

The Planning Officer, who is reviewing this application, Greg Logan, is an experienced local authority Officer. There has already been dialogue with Greg on this application and this will continue going forwards, as it is expected that in the near future there will be an application for residential development on this site.

EAST WEST RAIL UPDATE

The latest communication received by the Parish Council detailed:

As a key statutory stakeholder, I'm writing to share a brief update about the progress of East West Rail in light of the Planning and Infrastructure Bill currently passing through Parliament.

We're working alongside Government to understand how proposed changes may affect scheme delivery. If passed, the Bill could enable enhanced community benefits and more meaningful engagement.

As a result, we're reviewing our plans
— including the timing of the previously planned
January 2026 Statutory Consultation — and
expect to provide further detail in the autumn.
We're also continuing to consider recent
stakeholder feedback and developments
along the route, including the Universal
Studios announcement.

Going forward, we'll continue to actively seek and consider stakeholder feedback to help refine the project. This ongoing dialogue is central to building strong relationships and ensuring the scheme continues to reflect the needs and aspirations of the communities it will serve.

UNIVERSAL STUDIOS APPLICATION TO CENTRAL GOVERNMENT

Notification was received of this application having been made. Parish Councils are not a statutory consultee in this government process, however, Renhold Parish Council did agree to submit a response to this application which will have a far reaching impact not only on the current Renhold population but for generations to come. 
