

Unfortunately at the

At the meeting held by our Mayor, Tom Wootton, on 14th March regarding East West Rail, it became apparent that the main time to focus all our efforts on fighting against the northern route, will be in June, when the first part of the statutory consultation will be held. The precise route will be clearly set out (at last) and that is when we have to put together all the evidence possible to support a route other than the northern route. Also we should fight for the 4 track not the 6 track railway, which will avoid the demolition of the homes in Poets. It was suggested that it would cost £1 billion pounds more to construct the northern rather than a southern route, surely that has to carry some weight!

The front cover photos indicate the generosity shown by the Renhold residents in donating candles for Ukraine. With frequent power cuts the candles can be a source of light, heat and a means of cooking, for those whose lives have been devastated by the war in Ukraine.

The memorial gathering held for Rod in the Village Hall was a lovely occasion and the photos on display, together with the speeches, helped to remind us of how many facets there were to his character and how much he will be missed in the village. LETTER FROM THE VICAR

As you read this article Easter will be upon us. To me it is the most special time of the year and a season which is more significant in my faith than Christmas. I am sure we all know the "story" from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem on what we call Palm Sunday, through the Jewish feast of Passover and Maundy Thursday, then Jesus' death on the cross on Good Friday and then His resurrection on that first Easter morning. To the secular world in which we live, the glitter and tinsel of Christmas outshines the highs and lows of the spiritual roller coaster of Holy week and Easter, but to me, it is so much richer and more meaningful, in fact I know that by Easter Monday I will be full of the joys of the Resurrection but emotionally exhausted. On Easter Sunday we are holding our dawn service (at 6:15am) which has become a regular feature, but also later that morning is a family orientated Easter Communion service where we will be blessing our Easter/Paschal candle for 2024, renewing our Baptism vows and if all goes to plan, the talk during the service will feature up to 30 bars of chocolate – Yes 30 bars of chocolate in a church service - hopefully calories do not count on Easter Sunday!!

One of the things I have noticed about Renhold as a Parish and community over my 4 years with you, is your amazing generosity and your willingness to share your plenty with those who do not have enough. As you are probably aware, All Saints is a collection point for the Bedford foodbank donations and also for Baby foodbank donations where formulas, nappies, wipes etc can be left to be taken to those in need on a weekly basis. Your generosity is humbling and amazing. In addition to this, during January one of my friends from a previous parish contacted me and told me about a District Rotary campaign to collect old, unwanted, part used candles and melt them down to send to Ukraine where they would be used for heating, lighting and even reheating foods and liquids as their electricity supply is so affected by the war. I told the congregation about this one Sunday morning and put a small box out in the porch for people to drop off any candles they did not want - Renhold, I should have known, one box was nowhere near enough and I eventually made two trips, both with a full boot and heaped back seat, to the collection point where our donations were collated with others. One school locally heard about this project and every child in the school gave at least one candle which was accompanied by a note, a picture or a message for the people in Ukraine, unbelievable and so touching. I have received an email from my friend who tells me that the organisers had to make two van collections from his garage as response had been so amazing – with Renhold leading the way – He has sent me 3 photographs which I hope can be inserted in this article - All I can say is thank you. (see the front cover)

In my last article I told you about our "Friends" and their fundraising to help us fund restoration works – On Friday June 21st the friends are hosting a concert by the Alma Singers in church, which promises to be a great evening of music and enter-tainment. Please look out for posters around the parish giving more details, and I can confirm that Pam Rhodes (from Songs of Praise) will visit us and host an evening exploring our favourite hymns on Friday 1st November, which is All Saints Day, and will start our Patronal festival weekend.– More details will follow in the next few editions of Renhold news, so watch this space (and our social media pages)!

Letter to the Editor

Liz Taylor wrote to me asking if I could publicise the plight of a Ukrainian mother and her son. Please read below.

This is Valeria she is 26 and she is in Ukraine with her 4-year-old son Sviatoslav . They are in the Cherkasy region. Valeria has taken the dreadfully difficult decision to ask for help to come to the UK under the government scheme "Homes for Ukraine." She has friends here in Bedford and Ampthill who would support her if she can find a sponsor.

The constant stress of the air raids and drone attacks is frightening little Sviatoslav . He can't attend nursery or have any kind of normal childhood. Valeria is a trained pharmacist but now is working from home as a web designer. She speaks some English.

I am writing to you all because I am an avid reader of your magazine. I was born in Renhold along with my two brothers John and Philip Wainwright. I now work in Wiltshire supporting Ukrainian sponsors and refugees. I came across Valeria and her desire to be in the Bedford area and thought I would ask if anyone is able help her. The government pay £350 per month tax free to any sponsor. You have to agree to have them for a minimum of 6 months. You provide a bedroom that she and Sviatoslav can share, and the ability to use a kitchen and bathroom.

Space in the magazine is tight so I can't give any more details. However if you are interested in finding out more please contact me for an informal chat. It's a rewarding, life-changing opportunity. Thank you.

Recipe from Elaine Gaskell

Pork Fillet, Pancetta - Mustard Sauce

Serving Size : 4 Preparation Time :0:00 Categories : Pork & Ham

Amo	ount Measure	Ingredient
2		Pork Fillets
1	pack	pancetta
		black pepper
		mixed herbs
1		large onions sliced
1	clove	garlic crushed
1	tablespoons	wholegrain mustard
1/4	pint	double cream
Sma	III glass	Noilly Prat or very dry sherry Olive oil

Preparation Method

Sprinkle fillets with black pepper and cover with herbs. Wrap pancetta round the fillets. Place in roasting pan. Heat oven to about 200c and cook for approx. $\frac{3}{4}$ hour.

Sauce: Fry onions and garlic in olive oil until transparent. Add the Noilly Prat or sherry and the wholegrain mustard. Just before serving bring sauce up to heat and add the cream bring to the boil to thicken.

Spoon onions and sauce onto the centre of the plate and slice the fillet - put about 3 or 4 slices onto the onions.

You are 125th in the Queue !!!! Pauline Capell

Do any of these sound familiar to you ? 'Thank you for holding.' 'We appreciate your patience.' 'An operator will be with you shortly.' 'Your hold time is approximately 25 minutes.' Or, on hearing the message 'Your call is important to us ' have you, like me, shouted 'Oh no it's not or you'd **** answer it!'

I have recently had cause to phone a whole load of companies and public services after the death of my husband, and my different experiences tempted me to do a bit of research. The whole concept of hold music broken up by messages and sales pitches, was created quite accidentally by a man called Alfred Levy in 1962, an entrepreneur, inventor and factory owner. Up until then when calls were put on hold there was just silence, but Alfred found that an exposed loose wire touching a metal girder within his telephone system, was picking up a radio broadcast that was taking place from a radio station next door. This gave him the idea of filling the previous onhold silence with music. **Four years later the concept of hold music was patented**.

The Business Telephone Centre in the USA conducted a survey. 10,000 callers were subjected to one minute of total silence when put on hold, the result being that 50% hung up and, interestingly, 45% of those who remained on the line over estimated their one minute of wait time, believing it to be between 3-5 minutes. Another 10,000 callers experienced music during their one minute of wait time and only 30% hung up, whereas just 31 % remaining on line thought that they had been waiting for more than one minute.

This finding begs the question of what purpose "hold music" serves and the psychology behind the type of music chosen. It will come as no surprise that a complaints service favours something classical, maybe with sounds from nature in the background, that is purported to be calming and soothing. A sales line on the other hand could favour something more upbeat and energetic from pop culture. One of the main purposes in providing music is to reduce call desertion rate, as another statistic suggests that 30% of those who give up on calls will never return. It has also been suggested by other surveys that frustration for a caller begins to set in after just one and a half minutes. A good choice of music is said to demonstrate professionalism, showing that a business values its customer's time, and has put some thought into their experience while on hold. Businesses will also use this platform to convey information to their captive audiences such as promotions, business hours or self-service options.

To change or not to change the hold music regularly is yet another question to be addressed, a change being something which frequent callers may appreciate. All of this has become even more important and apposite with more and more people working from home and conducting business over the phone. Personally, from my own experience, my pet hate is my doctor's surgery who has chosen, in line with many other surgeries so I am told, to opt for something so ceaselessly, teeth clenchingly repetitive, you find yourself actually humming it for the rest of the day!!

In 2012, Australia's Sydney Morning Herald ran an article about a man who was on hold to Quantas Airline for 15 hours, accompanied by a frequent message telling him that a customer service agent would be with him soon !! He decided to test this out by keeping the line open whilst going about his other daily business. The article concluded by saying that the on-hold experience is the true purgatory of modern existence, a place of temporary damnation where the gentle wash of music is punctuated by occasional glimpses of the promised land ie: that 'your call is important to us and someone will be with you shortly.'

WILD ABOUT RENHOLD by Tony Ploszajski

Coltsfoot

Coltsfoot has been used medicinally for many hundreds of years to treat coughs, colds and sore throats, hence another of its popular common names, 'coughwort'. A common and creeping perennial plant of bare, damp or disturbed ground, Coltsfoot is found on waste ground, field edges and roadside verges. Its daisy-like, composite flower heads (made up to lots of tiny flowers) appear as early as February, well before the hoof-shaped leaves (hence its common name). Coltsfoot continues to flower until April. The fact that the flowers appear before the leaves has led to one of its other colloquial names, 'Son-before-father'.

Dog Violets

Dog Violets have been much in evidence around Renhold this spring, especially along grassy verges and footpaths. As their name suggests, their flowers are typically violet in colour, but there are some clumps of white violets, although they are generally not in quite such close proximity as the flowers in the photo. The plant gets its 'Dog' prefix from the fact that its flowers are scentless so it was considered inferior to other violets. It is often an indicator of ancient woodland, so its presence alongside paths and hedgerows in Renhold is a good sign that our current landscape has been around for quite a while.

Bullfinch


Marie Baird, spotted this lovely male Bullfinch in her back garden, one of a pair. Bullfinches have become increasingly scarce in the past few years. Although one of the most colourful native British species, the Bullfinch can easily pass unnoticed in the garden as it prefers thick foliage and is shy in its behaviour. When their winter seed supply runs out they will turn to eating tree buds, which is the reason the species has historically been so unpopular with fruit growers, as the birds will often strip a fruit tree, such as apple, of its fruit buds. The Bullfinch's song is a quiet warbling and its call a distinctive 'creaky' whistle, which can be heard even when the birds are hidden. A fairly large finch compared with other species, the male has a deep pink chest and underparts, black cap and a white rump which is often the main feature seen as it flies off. The female is a greyer version but with a similar plumage pattern.

Renhold Neighbourhood Plan Working Group (RNPWG)-update

Following the appointment of AECOM, a government approved body, to provide professional services in preparing the Renhold Plan, two representatives recently visited Renhold and were conducted on a tour of all areas of the Parish. This was to allow them to gain a first-hand knowledge of the Parish, and its environs, with particular references to: its rural setting, landscape character, build character, relationship of the newer parts to both urban Bedford and rural Renhold, the characterful Ends and Green Gaps together with the natural habitats and biodiversity.

Using this information and the results of preceding resident consultations and surveys, a Renhold Design Code will be drawn up, aimed at safeguarding Renhold Parish for the foreseeable future, but subject to a review in 2030. It is anticipated that the report will be available for discussion in May 2024.

This will take us closer to presenting the 'Plan' to Renhold residents by way of public consultation in the not too distant future. **Keith Herkes**

GENERAL HIGHWAYS SAFETY LATEST

The Parish Council were pleased to see the completion of the Wilden Road/Pinchcut Hill highways surfacing work as well as the footway works in Salph End at Ravensden Road. <u>The actions from the highways walkround with</u> Borough Council Officers and Borough Councillor Jim Weir Deputy Mayor & Portfolio Holder for Environment, Highways & Transport continue to be followed up.

The Parish Council have sent a request to the local authority to ask the Borough Council for an extension to the 30mph speed limit in Ravensden Road, with substantial evidence provided to show the highways safety benefits that it would bring. The vehicle activated speed data continues to be downloaded monthly, and shared with the highways authority Bedford Borough Council and as well as the local Police team.

WHAT HAS THE PARISH COUNCIL BEEN UP TO?

It has continued to be a busy time with a number of items being worked on including:

Securing part funding (\pounds 2,250) for three new defibrillator devices, one to be located at sites in: the Spires, Aspire and Cranbourne Gardens with the Parish Council funding the remaining amount (\pounds 2,250)

Arrangement of a community training event on defibrillator use open to residents to attend being planned for early summer

Noticeboard improvements work being undertaken across the parish

Cllrs. Brunsden, Roberts and and Gribble attended the Campaign to Protect Rural England Planning Workshop recently, as well as Cllrs. Warwicker and Gribble attending Chairmanship training

Grass cutting contractor appointment alongside other village maintenance EAST WEST RAIL CONSULTATION UPDATE

The Parish Council understand that the next round of public consultation will be starting in early June, it is expected this will run for approximately six weeks. If the government announce a general election prior to the start of the public consultation period it is believed that the public consultation will not commence and will be put on hold. If a general election announcement is made during the public consultation period, the consultation will continue as planned.

Unveiling the Road to Emmaus: A Biblical Encounter with Meaning for All.




