EDITORIAL By Anne Grant

It is hard to believe, as I write this, that summer is coming to an end and there are some important dates to put in your diaries between now and Christmas. On Saturday 5th October is a concert organised by the WI which promises to be great fun. (p12).There will be an Autumn Craft Fair on Sat 26th October at the village hall and on Friday 1st November there is to be an evening with Pam Rhodes (p17) and tickets are available now. On 16th November there is a WW 2 experience to be held in Wilden Village Hall (p19) and later on Sat 23rd November there is a coffee morning and mini market with all sorts of stalls and free entry (p10) to be held at All Saints Church.

There are some new initiatives starting up one of which is Messy Church which can be seen on p17 and was much enjoyed by all who came. Then Debra Aitkin from BRCC is interested in finding out if people in Renhold would be interested in starting up a Good Neighbours Scheme, and if there are many people who would be interested in volunteering (p13). I'm sure everyone could do with a good neighbour.

What a fantastic set of photos on Tony's "Wild about Renhold" page and such interesting and diverse examples of our local wildlife. Please do keep sending them in, Tony appreciates all the help he can get. There is also a plea from Sarah Flynn to help support the declining swift population by installing swift boxes for them to build their nests, and there is also a request for anyone keeping birds at home to register them or they will be breaking the law. It is in an effort to help control bird flu (see p19 and p25) and the deadline is the 1st October.

After the excellent article by some of the school children about online safety in the last issue, I was sent some information from the police which I thought made a very appropriate sequel (p22).

I recently attended a meeting in Ravensden Village Hall organised by BFARe (Bedford For a Reconsultation) to bring us up to date on East West Rail plans. Our Borough Councillor Nicky Gribble has been fighting the fight and writing to the papers about their ridiculous plans to choose the northern route past Ravensden and Renhold. After much persistence, further information has been gleaned, such as the horrendous possibility of them intending to possess the car park at Bedford Hospital, so the area could be used for EWR construction activities. How can a hospital possibly function without a car park? The demolition and reconstruction of four key bridges in Bedford will cause unbelievable chaos for about 6 to 7 years. In addition a terrain profile has been produced which brings home very clearly how much earth movement will be needed, to construct the cuttings and embankments needed for diesel trains to traverse the steep hills on the proposed northern route. It makes no sense. The company has kept their plans very close to their chest, such that many people are totally in the dark about all the chaos that will be unleashed in the process if it goes ahead.

Finally Rev. Ian will be much in our thoughts in the coming weeks, as he has to go into hospital for an operation. He is working hard to cover all essential services in his absence, and I know we will all want to wish him well and hope he makes a speedy recovery, and a return to good health as soon as possible. LETTER FROM THE VICAR

Greetings from the Vicarage, as I write this month there is a definite autumnal feel in the air, the recent weeks of warm/hot, dry weather seem to have passed and as I walked the dogs this morning, there was that cool, breezy damp feel suggesting summer is now over. Having said that, what a summer we have enjoyed, but hasn't it flown past!

You may remember in my last article I made an appeal for old/new/unwanted candles for shipping to Ukraine. This project is live and will be extended a couple of weeks into October to allow for more of your donations to be collected. A box is situated in the church porch to deposit your donations which will be sent for processing and transportation before the winter in Ukraine takes hold. This is a valuable and vital initiative supporting ordinary people and families who are living in and through dangerous and challenging conditions; it may not seem much but if we can all do our small part, it will make a huge difference - I really appreciate your support with this, thank you.

The Church Council at All Saints is keen to extend its support for all in in the Parish of Renhold. To enable us to develop appropriate initiatives that are relevant to Renhold today, we would like your views on what we as a church offer you now, and what you would like to see going forward. A short survey is being created which we hope to make available in both hard and soft copies in the last quarter of this year to gain your views, when you see this please take just a few minutes to complete it and help us to establish what current/future needs are – Thank you.

Continuing with our initiatives to work with families and young people, the team at All Saints have started a monthly "Messy Church". The sessions last up to 90 minutes and include multiple activities for all ages (up to 11yrs), games, a short act of worship and refreshments. The sessions take place in the Chapter House at 3:30pm on the third Wednesday of each month and are open to anyone, please see posters around the Parish for more details. As a result of feedback from the "messy families" we are exploring a "Mums & Tots" group and a "school run café" in addition to our planned "Youth group" initially for year 6/7 children which we hope will start in October.

Our "Friends of All Saints Church" are busy raising funds to help in the restoration and improvement of the fabric, preserving it for generations to come. On Friday 1st November at 7:30pm, Pam Rhodes from Songs of Praise will be with us as we spend an hour or so exploring some of our favourite hymns. Pam last came to us at the end of COVID where numbers were restricted, so it is great that we can revisit this really enjoyable event in "better times!" Tickets will be available shortly

Our popular "Remembered with Love" service takes place on Sunday 27th October at 3:00pm; this is where we find time and space to remember those who we love, and we see no longer. We use readings, poetry and music as we reflect on our treasured memories, and light a candle as a sign of our love shining through. The service concludes with the planting of some bulbs in the churchyard which will come up in the springtime and we then join together for refreshments in the Chapter House afterwards. This service is not only for people who "come to church" but open to all and all will be very welcome.

Details of all services for October are listed within this magazine, and these will be live streamed where possible using the All Saints Renhold Facebook page. I recently had family from abroad staying with me which meant more bedrooms were being used than usual. Shock horror when I realised that one of the sliding mirrored wardrobe doors had come off its runners and, try as I might, I could not get it back. I had no choice but to try and contact the firm who had installed them **about 40 years ago when we moved in!!!!** I couldn't find any paperwork so resorted to the internet. The name **Mirrorspan** jumped out at me and rang bells, but I knew the company wasn't there anymore. I rang up, the phone was answered immediately, and I was able to talk to a very helpful human! I said "Did you used to have a shop in Great Barford" and they confirmed they had. **Halleluia!**

I explained the problem and "James" suggested coming round that afternoon to see what the problem was and see if it could be fixed. I **couldn't believe my luck**. He came round as promised and eventually managed to get the door back on the runners, but suggested we treat it carefully. He also had a look at the same doors in a second bedroom and although it was still functioning one of the runners had also broken. James suggested sending his fitters round to see if they could repair them both. Apparently, they had a large box full of odds and ends from days gone by, and may have some replacement runners that could be used.

To cut a long story short the fitters found a runner that could be modified to fit and after two more visits have replaced all the runners on 10 wardrobe doors. It is amazing that the doors have lasted as long as they have, and even more amazing that the company have gone to **SO** much trouble to keep them going, when it would have been very easy just to say "No they can't be fixed". In all for the wardrobe doors in 3 bedrooms the total cost to have all the brackets replaced is £300 and all done from start to finish in a week. Good Neighbour Schemes

Good Neighbour Schemes are run by volunteers with support from Beds Rural Communities Charity. I am currently looking at the potential for a group in Renhold after some interest was shown by residents and organisations working locally.

A Good Neighbour Scheme is a group of volunteers who are able to help local residents with jobs such as shopping, lifts to the hospital/doctors or simply popping round for a chat - anything one neighbour might do for another and not jobs that would be carried out by a professional service.

The schemes offer support to residents where local services may be reducing or people do not have family locally and need help with occasional, ad hoc jobs to enable them to maintain independence, continue to attend social events and be less isolated.

BRCC offer support in setting up and running the scheme with ongoing training, information sessions and social events for groups to meet and share experiences.

All volunteers are insured and have a DBS check. You can offer as much/ little time as you are able – all support is valued and makes a difference.

SWIFTS ARE IN DECLINE . The Opportunity

Swifts, the masters of the skies, are in decline and are on the red list of endangered species. Natural nesting holes in old buildings have been diminishing so the more potential nesting sites we can create, the better. Swift boxes represent an opportunity to provide a solution. You may want to help and install swift boxes on your property if it is suitable, ideally on a wall over 4 metres high and an aspect not receiving full sun through the day. A poem created by a group of people with early stage dementia. We covered a table with a host of leaves, berries, fruit, nuts etc and came up with words to describe what they looked like, their colour, texture and things they reminded us of. Before we knew it – we had ourselves a poem.

And here on the woodland floor. a pile of feathers striped grey and black. Pigeon ? Magpie ? A hungry fox's dinner ? In the hedgerows, old man's beard trails down. delicate, soft, fluffy. Purple sloes wait for the first frost to split their skins, while blackberries, once fat and juicy, turn mushy in the falling rain. Spiders spin their lacy webs to catch the morning dew that will transform them into glittering stars. It is the apple season – gritty skinned russets, crisp red devils and waxy bramleys to make an apple tart and custard. Oh the spectacle of Autumn.



WILD ABOUT RENHOLD by Tony Ploszajski

1. Parent Bugs

I spotted this cluster of Parent Bugs on a single Silver Birch leaf in our garden. The Parent Bug is so-named because the adult females take such good care of their young. While the other shield bugs lay their eggs and then leave their young to fend for themselves, the Parent Bug is a dedicated mother. She lays her eggs in a tight cluster on the underside of a Silver birch leaves, and then she broods her clutch, sitting protectively over the eggs until they hatch. She stays with her family until the young finally become adults. This protection helps to prevent attack by parasitic wasps. The young have various developmental stages before becoming adults – the ones in the photo are nymphs, the final stage before adulthood, when they all disperse from their hitherto communal existence.

2. Magpie

This very bald Magpie appeared on our lawn in August, looking very much the worse for wear, so what was going on? Like almost all birds, adult Magpies moult their feathers after the breeding season. Moult begins in June or July and ends in September or October. Their primary flight feathers are replaced sequentially over a period of three months, so they retain the ability to fly. Head and neck feathers are less critical to its overall functioning, so may be shed all at once. Either way, they look very scruffy whilst the feathers re-grow and with a bare head, look very like a small vulture!

3. Gatekeeper butterfly

Gatekeeper butterflies are quite common along hedgerows in Renhold and Teresa Trangmar sent this photo of one. Also known as the Hedge Brown, it gets its name from frequenting gaps in hedges where clumps of flowers grow in gateways and along field edges. One of its favourite food sources is Bramble flowers and given the frequency of brambles along many of the hedgerows in the parish, it has plenty of its favoured plants to choose from. It is widespread in southern Britain and its range has extended northwards in recent years.

4. Elephant Hawk Moth Caterpillar

Pauline Brown spotted this amazing Elephant Hawk Moth caterpillar on her patio in Home Close and her daughter Tania was kind enough to send it to me. The moth is named after the appearance of its caterpillar, which look like an elephants trunk. They grow to about three inches (8cm) in length and also have a spiked 'tail' and two sets of eye spots just behind their head, to intimidate potential predators. When they hatch into adult moths, they have a striking combination of pink and olive green wing markings and are mostly nocturnal.

5.White-lipped Snail

We spotted this White-lipped Snail on a damp tree trunk after a rain shower, one of several that were climbing the bark. The White-lipped snail varies in colour but is typically yellow or pinkish. It has up to five brown bands around the whorl of the shell. It can be identified by the white branding around the lip of its shell, which distinguishes it from the similar, Brown-lipped snail. White-lipped snails are hermaphrodites, so have organs of both sexes. However, they need to mate in order for each snail to fertilise their own eggs. They then bury their eggs in soil.

ENDGAME-DO YOU KNOW WHO YOUR CHILD IS TALKING TO ONLINE

We are seeing more and more children becoming victims of sexual abuse through online games, social networking sites and apps, which they can access through their tablets, mobile phones and games consoles.

Sadly, not everyone online is who they claim to be. Grooming can happen both in person and online, often by a stranger, but it can also be someone they know.

We have recently launched a county-wide online safety campaign, which is aimed at teenagers and young people to educate them on how to stay safe online, how to report any concerns and where to access support.

Called #ENDGAME, the aim of the campaign is to encourage teenagers to think about the potential dangers of being active online.

This will be implemented as a phased campaign delivered over the course of several months and will cover five different topics, with targeted posts on Snapchat and Instagram aimed at teenagers and young people, encouraging them to BLOCK, REPORT, TELL if something doesn't feel right.

There will also be accompanying posts on Facebook and Instagram for parents and carers and dedicated campaign pages for both audiences on the force website, containing information and signposting to support.

Statistics on the NSPCC website state that there has been an 82 percent rise in online grooming crimes against children in the last five years.

It can be difficult to tell if your child is being groomed – the signs aren't always obvious and may be hidden.

Some signs to look out for:

· Is your child being secretive about how they're spending their time?

• Do they have an older boyfriend or girlfriend?

 $\cdot\,$ Do they have money or new things like clothes and mobile phones that they can't or won't explain?

- · Are they drinking or taking drugs?
- · Are they spending more or less time than usual online or on their devices?
- · Do they seem upset or withdrawn?
- · Are they using sexual language you wouldn't expect them to know?

 $\cdot\,$ Are they spending more time away from home or going missing for periods of time?

We are encouraging you to familiarise yourself with some of the signs to look out for and to talk to your children about their online activity, what apps they use, games they like to play and sites they regularly visit and let them know they can come to you if something they don't like happens online - whatever that is.

Ward Councillor update August and September

Hello again, I hope you have had a lovely summer holiday- the sun did shine and was kind for the time when the children were off school.

I have been busy over the summer, mainly with residents' queries and applying for Ward Funding to support community groups. I do still have some funds left over, so please contact me if you are a local community/volunteering group and need a bit of help financially.

For those of us who are backyard poultry or bird keepers, a new rule affecting registering your birds comes into effect on October 1st. Anyone who keeps birds with access to the outdoors must register their flock with DEFRA <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/register-as-a-keeper-of-less-than-50-poultry-or-other-captive-birds</u> This is so keepers of birds can be contacted quickly in the event of a disease outbreak or health update to prevent further spread.

As we all are aware, the Universal Winter Fuel Allowance has been terminated by the Government. It will now be awarded on a means-tested basis. There are an estimated 850,000 pensioners who may be eligible for the allowance through pension credits but do not claim. <u>https://www.gov.uk/winter-fuelpayment/eligibility</u> Please check to see if you qualify. There is an eight week backlog on applications but if one is received on or before 21st December, the claim will be backdated.

East West Rail continues to be at the forefront of a lot of people's minds. The consequence on Bedford Town and further afield is becoming clearer. Please take time to familiarise yourself on this project because if it goes ahead as currently planned, the day-to-day life of us all trying to get about in town, use the station and visit the hospital will be seriously impacted. More information will be available when EWR announce the statutory consultation.

On another issue, I would like to remind you that the Inland Drainage Board will be carrying out essential maintenance this autumn/winter on Renhold Brook from Go Outdoors to where it goes under the B660 in Ravensden. The work may be carried out by hand or machine so please be aware of this going on.

My council meetings have restarted after the August break and the next Full Council meeting is on 9th October, 6.30pm at Borough Hall. It is also screened live on-line. Members of the public are welcome to join and ask questions or I can ask for you. Please contact me in good time if you would like me to help.


